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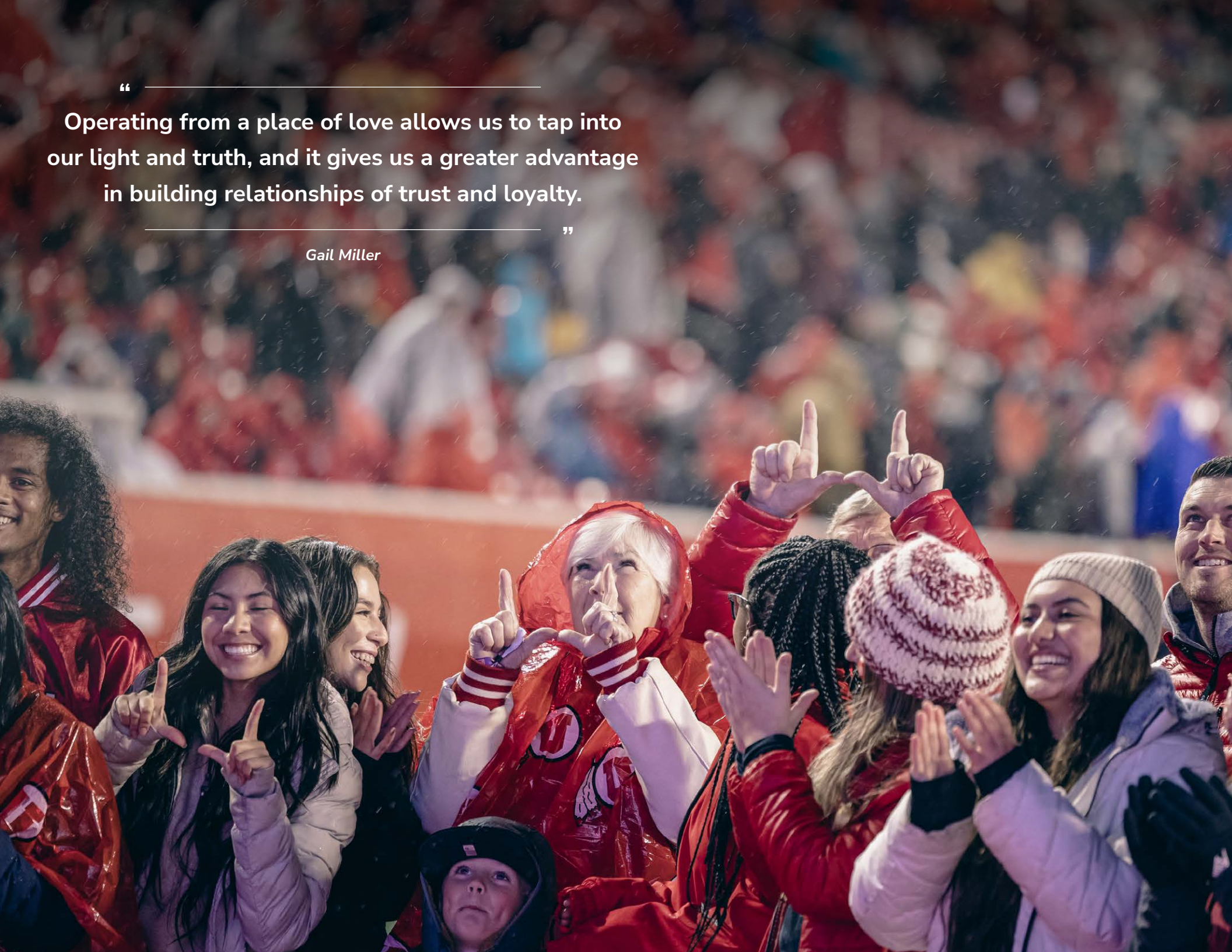

DOING GOOD. TOGETHER.

Service is the universal ingredient that brings us all together. I have tried to focus on service in each season of life — serving my mother and father, raising a family and caring for a home, supporting an energetic and entrepreneurial husband, building and protecting a company, and serving my neighbors and community.

Operating from a place of love allows us to tap into our light and truth, and it gives us a greater advantage in building relationships of trust and loyalty. When you open your heart, you find an energy that sustains you and gives you purpose.

In 2022, we celebrated the 20th anniversary of the Larry H. & Gail Miller Enrichment Scholarship program at the University of Utah. This scholarship awards full tuition and fees, on-campus room and board, mentoring resources, career services and a textbook allowance to first generation students pursuing their education at the University of Utah. More than 200 students have had access to an education and resources that otherwise might have been unable to pursue their education. Judge Andy Valdez, Utah's first Hispanic judge, was the inspiration for Larry and me to create the Miller Enrichment Scholarship program.

At eleven years old, Andy was struggling and did not have the resources to be successful. He was selling newspapers on the corner to support his family. A man named Jack Keller met Andy, gave him a job and taught him to play tennis at the local country club. He took him to competitions and tournaments all over Salt Lake City. Andy started excelling in the classroom and on the tennis court. Then one day, Jack disappeared. He had lost his business and moved to California.

Andy went back to his old ways and stopped playing tennis. However, members of the community reached out to Andy and involved him in the game again.

He started competing around Utah and the United States. Andy then attended college and eventually law school. Andy Valdez ultimately became Judge Andy Valdez, the first Hispanic judge in Utah.

One day he was at the grocery store and saw a man panhandling outside. He immediately realized it was Jack Keller. Andy took Jack in and looked after him until he passed.

Judge Andy Valdez has given back to our community in many ways and is a champion for children. Larry heard Andy's story when he was receiving an award at Salt Lake Community College. This experience inspired Larry and me to create the Miller Enrichment Scholarship program using Judge Valdez's advice and recommendations.

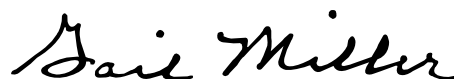

The Larry H. & Gail Miller Family Foundation was created in 2007 as a way for the Miller family to continue their legacy of giving and to include future generations of the family. The Miller Family Foundation supports programs that enrich lives and communities in the areas of health and medicine, shelter and food security, education and skill development, jobs and economic self-reliance, and cultural and spiritual enrichment.

The Larry H. Miller Education Foundation provides educational assistance to dependent children of full-time employees of the Larry H. Miller Company and its portfolio of businesses. Inspired by Larry and Gail's love of education, the Larry H. Miller Education Foundation has helped more than 4,500 students further their education at 180 different universities, colleges, and trade schools throughout the United States.





The Driven 2 Teach program makes American history come alive in the classroom by taking Utah public school teachers to important historical sites. The hands-on seminars are designed to inform, inspire, and support excellent classroom teaching. Since 2007, Driven 2 Teach has hosted 325 teachers, impacting over 800,000 students.

Formed in 1995, Larry H. Miller Charities is an employee-funded and coordinated 501(c)(3) public charity whose mission focuses on supporting programs that help women and children, especially in the areas of health and education. Financial grants are made to qualified nonprofits that are located in communities where the Larry H. Miller Company portfolio businesses are based. Funds are generated through LHM employee and company contributions, including the Give Us 5 program, through which employees may choose to donate \$5 per paycheck or more.



NEXT GENERATION GIVING

The Miller Legacy Project provides an educational giving experience to future generations of the Miller family and is specifically designed to perpetuate the philanthropic legacy of Gail and Larry. Many initiatives require long-term and a generational commitment. Future generations of Millers work together to enrich the community through cultivating a culture of generosity and service within the Miller family. Miller family members can participate in the Miller Legacy Project at the age of 12. In 2022, two fourth-generation Millers had the opportunity to give, reflecting the vision and heart of the Miller Legacy Project — their responsibility to learn to give back and their stewardship to enrich lives.

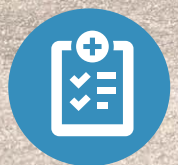

DRIVING OUT DIABETES

Larry H. Miller passed away from complications of Type 2 diabetes when he was 64. Since 2017, the Larry H. & Gail Miller Family Foundation has donated over \$4.2 million to the University of Utah Health's Driving Out Diabetes Initiative to help prevent individuals and their families from suffering under the burden of diabetes.

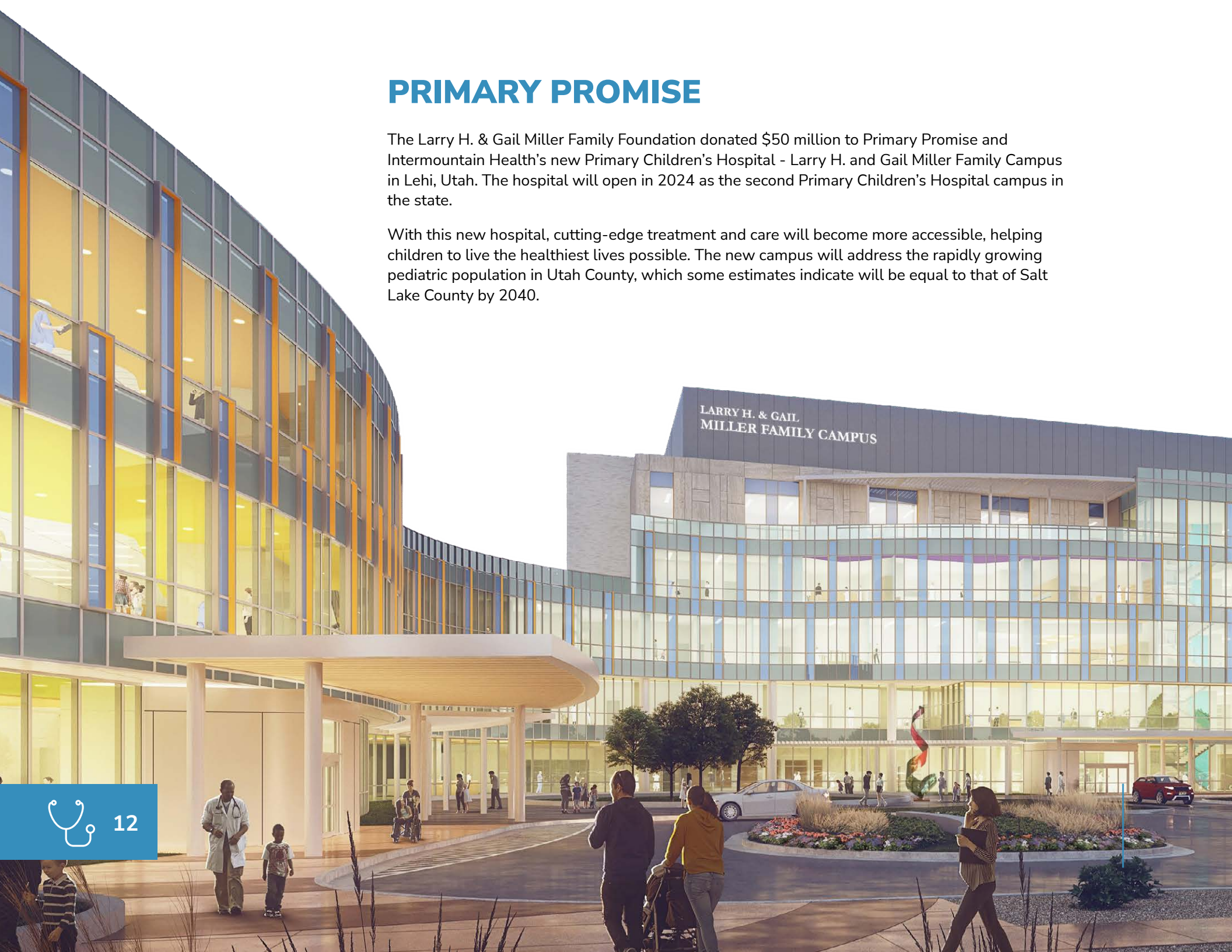

PRIMARY PROMISE

The Larry H. & Gail Miller Family Foundation donated \$50 million to Primary Promise and Intermountain Health's new Primary Children's Hospital - Larry H. and Gail Miller Family Campus in Lehi, Utah. The hospital will open in 2024 as the second Primary Children's Hospital campus in the state.

With this new hospital, cutting-edge treatment and care will become more accessible, helping children to live the healthiest lives possible. The new campus will address the rapidly growing pediatric population in Utah County, which some estimates indicate will be equal to that of Salt Lake County by 2040.



Todd and Andie Pedersen donated \$35 million to the new Primary Children's Hospital. The Pedersens indicated their gift was inspired by the Miller family's generosity and the Primary Promise vision. Later, Ryan and Ashley Smith donated \$20 million, inspired by Todd and Andi Pedersen. There is power in collaborative giving.

Access to quality and timely health care decreases the risk of poor health outcomes and health disparities. We partner with our community's leading institutions to provide state-of-the-art resources to address these needs. Prevention, mental health services and services for our vulnerable and marginalized communities are essential to the healthcare ecosystem. We invest in projects and programs that ensure our communities have access to the healthcare resources and services needed to live long and thriving lives.

SHELTER AND FOOD SECURITY

We enrich lives by increasing sustainable access to housing, food and other basic needs while also addressing the root causes of poverty.



Homelessness is driven by a myriad of issues ranging from mental health, abuse, lack of education, unemployment, addiction and sometimes bad luck. Together we can and must build a community where everyone is welcome, and their contributions are valued. Our donations have focused on providing direct services to those in need.



SHELTER THE HOMELESS

Shelter the Homeless is committed to making homelessness rare, brief and non-recurring by connecting individuals who are experiencing homelessness with community services that help them achieve housing stability and reach sustainable self-sufficiency. In 2017, the Larry H. & Gail Miller Family Foundation made a \$10 million contribution to support Shelter the Homeless and the establishment of four Homeless Resource Centers in Salt Lake County: Gail Miller Resource Center, Geraldine E. King Women's Resource Center, Pamela Atkinson Resource Center and Midvale Family Resource Center. We are grateful to the service providers, including Volunteers of America and The Road Home, for helping operate the Homeless Resource Centers.

The Foundation has continued to support the work of Shelter the Homeless and provided an additional \$1 million contribution in 2022 for renovations and facility upgrades at the Gail Miller Resource Center.

SEASON OF SERVICE THANKSGIVING EVENT

In 2022, the Larry H. & Gail Miller Family Foundation and the Larry H. Miller Company partnered with Salt Lake County to provide meals and a wide range of services to guests, particularly those experiencing homelessness, through the Driven to Assist: Season of Service event. Community partners joined to make this a memorable and meaningful event.

More than 200 volunteers served 3,200 Thanksgiving meals to guests at the Salt Palace Convention Center in downtown Salt Lake City. Volunteers included members of the Miller family, employees of the Larry H. Miller Company and its portfolio of businesses, Salt Lake County Mayor Jenny Wilson and Salt Lake County employees, and Salt Lake City Mayor Erin Mendenhall and Salt Lake City employees.

The Miller family has provided Thanksgiving meals for individuals experiencing homelessness and food insecurity in Salt Lake City for the past 24 years.



FAMILY PROMISE OF OGDEN

The Larry H. & Gail Miller Family Foundation donated \$200,000 to Family Promise of Ogden, which provides shelter and resources for young families experiencing homelessness. Guests receive assistance in regaining self-sufficiency and sustaining independence.

UTAH IMPACT PARTNERSHIP

A 2020 study from the Kem C. Gardner Institute helped the community recognize the need to change how homelessness was addressed in Utah. Gail Miller is a member of the Utah Impact Partnership on behalf of the Larry H. & Gail Miller Family Foundation. The Miller Family Foundation contributed funds to the partnership along with other donors. The Utah Impact Partnership teamed with the Utah Homelessness Council to coordinate efforts and funding for homeless services throughout Utah.

To date, nearly \$2.5 million in grants have been deployed to secure housing and facilities and to provide resources to hundreds of Utahns seeking social services, health services and living assistance.

We continue to champion the work of service providers who work tirelessly to provide shelter and aid to the unsheltered population, including Shelter the Homeless, Volunteers of America Utah, The Road Home, Youth Futures, Family Promise of Ogden, Lantern House and the INN Between.



ENRICHMENT SCHOLARS 20TH ANNIVERSARY

For 20 years, students have received the Larry H. and Gail Miller Enrichment Scholarship to further their academic pursuits at the University of Utah and help them make significant contributions to the community. For recipients, the Larry H. & Gail Miller Family Foundation-funded scholarship means an opportunity to be the first in their family to attend college. The Miller Family Foundation has donated \$13 million to the scholarship program since 2002.

SCHOLARSHIP FOR SINGLE PARENTS



The Greg and Heidi Miller Single Parent Scholarship was created to help single parents obtain an education at the University of Utah to improve their earning potential and break the cycle of working multiple jobs and intergenerational poverty. Six students participated in the first cohort for the 2022-2023 academic year. On behalf of Greg and Heidi Miller, the foundation contributed financial support for the scholarships, which includes full tuition and a living stipend.



GAIL MILLER SCHOOL OF BUSINESS

Salt Lake Community College provides an accessible education to students who desire to learn. The Larry H. & Gail Miller Family Foundation and Gail Miller donated \$10 million to Salt Lake Community College to modernize its business building and transform its academic business programs. The new Gail Miller School of Business is the only business school in Utah named exclusively after a woman.

MARS CENTER

The Larry H. & Gail Miller Family Foundation donated \$3.5 million to the new Miller Advanced Research and Solutions (MARS) Center at Weber State University. The center will provide opportunities for students to gain innovative skills for successful careers in advanced manufacturing, help support technical industries such as aerospace and defense, and launch start-up businesses. Students, faculty, university partners and the community can collaborate and prepare students to lead and make a difference in our communities.

MARS has helped 25 small businesses by creating a space where they can access equipment and Weber State University expertise to help with prototype development and do small batches of manufacturing. The MARS Center collaborates with the Grow UTAH accelerator program to provide access to classroom and conference space for business mentoring and instruction.





CENTER FOR CONSTITUTIONAL STUDIES

The Larry H. & Gail Miller Family Foundation gifted a \$3 million endowment to create a directorship at Utah Valley University's Center for Constitutional Studies.

JON M. HUNTSMAN SCHOOL OF BUSINESS

In 2022, The Larry H. and Gail Miller Family Foundation provided \$2.5 million to support the Huntsman School of Business at Utah State University. The Huntsman School of Business is investing in existing experiential learning programming and adding opportunities to allow all Huntsman students to participate in meaningful and relevant learning in and out of the classroom.

The new building will house expanding experiential learning programs and create room for new initiatives, such as a program aimed at supporting female students and a new Analytics Solutions Center. It will also include professional co-working space for student use for remote internships or other needs.





JOBS AND ECONOMIC SELF-RELIANCE

We enrich lives by improving economic mobility and opportunity for individuals and families through access to job training, career development, and financial/digital services.

We believe a thriving workforce helps build strong and healthy communities. We support organizations that strive to help individuals access job training, find and maintain gainful employment and provide opportunities for career growth. Individuals with steady employment are less likely to live in poverty and more likely to live healthy lives.

The Other Side Academy is providing an innovative solution to help one of our most vulnerable populations experiencing chronic homelessness — those who have been incarcerated and are exiting the prison system.

The Other Side Academy provides a two-year residential program and a six-month transitional program offering vocational training, education, peer counseling, mentoring, leadership training and transitional services.

Over 400 Utahns will have permanent supportive housing through The Other Side Village in a therapeutic and sustainable community. In addition to housing, residents will have important wrap-around services that will help build accountability, sobriety, self-reliance and community contribution.

The Larry H. & Gail Miller Family Foundation has committed \$1 million toward The Other Side Village. We see this as an exciting solution that can be replicated in Utah, the United States and the world.



CLEAN SLATE UTAH

Clean Slate Utah, which assists a vulnerable population with jobs and economic self-reliance, was the recipient of a \$200,000 donation from the Larry H. & Gail Miller Family Foundation.

1 in 4 Utahns have some type of criminal record and even old and minor records create huge barriers to opportunities. Clean Slate Utah seeks to serve people with criminal records and connect them with second chances. By informing individuals with records about Utah's Clean Slate law, individuals can access greater employment and housing opportunities.

WOMEN OF THE WORLD

Women of the World provides services for displaced refugee women and their families as they adjust to life in Utah. In 2022, Utah welcomed 397 refugees from 22 countries and 900 Afghani humanitarian parolees. Services provided include English classes, career and educational development, mentorship, citizenship preparation and more.

Zion National Park Forever Project - East Zion Initiative

The Zion National Park Forever Project aims to protect and conserve sacred and significant landscapes and resources. The East Zion Initiative will construct the East Zion Visitor Center, trail and trailhead easements for a new trails system and help with conservation of the area. In 2022, The Foundation donated \$250,000 to support the project. Approximately 1.5 million guests enter Zion National Park through the east gate and the East Zion Initiative creates a better visitor experience while guests explore the beautiful Park.

Tracy Aviary

The Tracy Aviary Jordan River Nature Center created an innovative program with the Pamela Atkinson Resource Center in South Salt Lake to help care for gardens and plants. Students from the University of Utah's Social Work Program joined the initiative and assisted with programming and activities for guests staying at the Pamela Atkinson Resource Center.

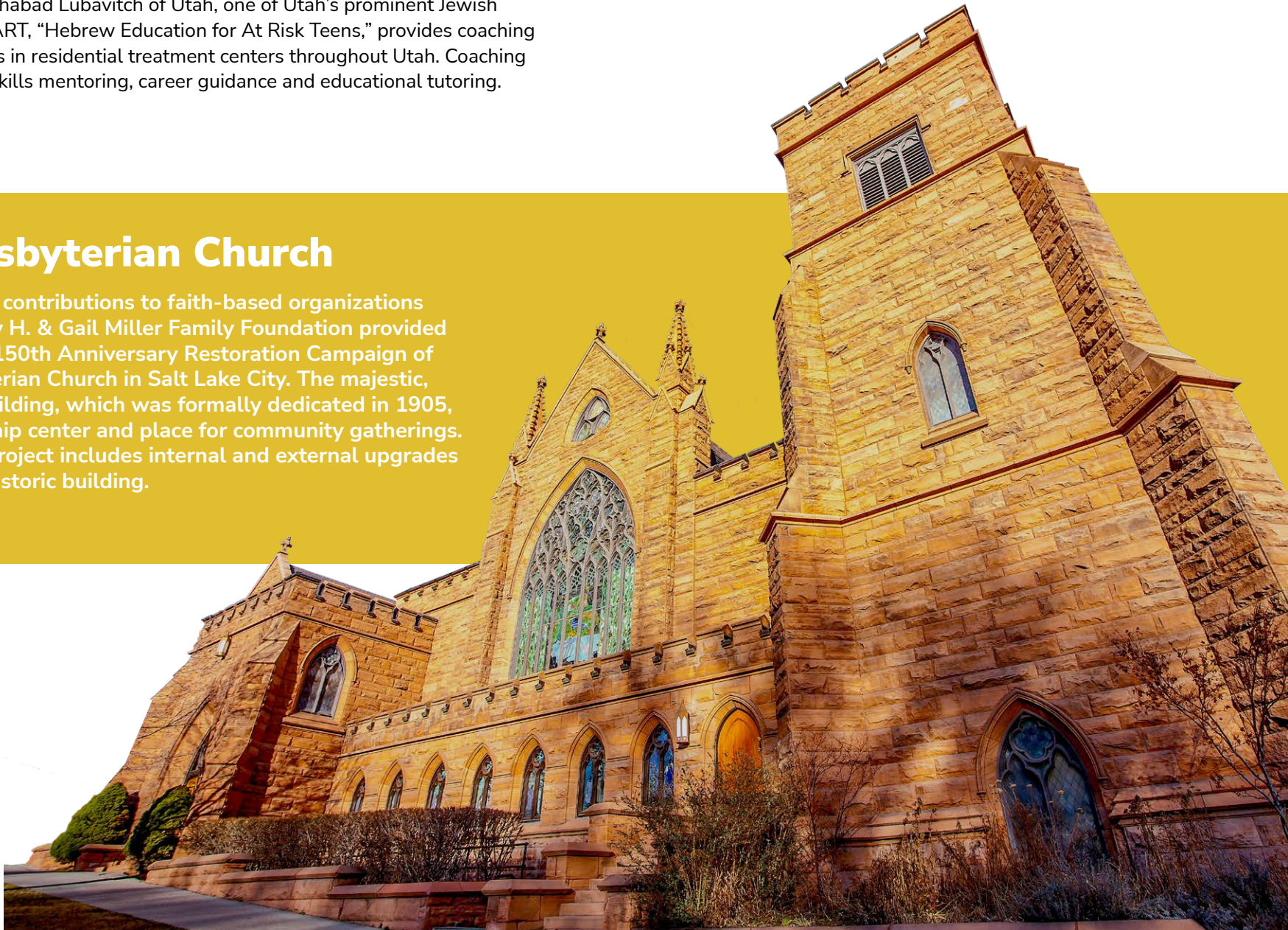


Chabad Lubavitch of Utah

Additionally, in 2022 the Miller Family Foundation supported “Project HEART,” an initiative of the Chabad Lubavitch of Utah, one of Utah’s prominent Jewish centers. Project HEART, “Hebrew Education for At Risk Teens,” provides coaching to hundreds of teens in residential treatment centers throughout Utah. Coaching includes life/social skills mentoring, career guidance and educational tutoring.

First Presbyterian Church

Among the many contributions to faith-based organizations in 2022, the Larry H. & Gail Miller Family Foundation provided \$100,000 to the 150th Anniversary Restoration Campaign of the First Presbyterian Church in Salt Lake City. The majestic, red sandstone building, which was formally dedicated in 1905, serves as a worship center and place for community gatherings. The restoration project includes internal and external upgrades to preserve the historic building.



The Nature Conservancy in Utah

Connecting People & Nature in Utah: More than 1,400 fourth-grade students participated in The Nature Conservancy in Utah's Wings & Water program. Students participated in fun, interactive lessons about the Great Salt Lake's ecosystem. The Larry H. & Gail Miller Family Foundation supported the Nature Conservancy education programming in 2022 with a donation of \$50,000.

Maestro Fischer introduced a series of statewide outdoor tours by the orchestra to present free concerts in rural communities against the backdrop of Utah's splendid high desert and mountain scenery.

PHILANTHROPY DAY

DRIVEN TO ASSIST: UTAH FOR UKRAINE

At the launch of Driven to Assist: Utah for Ukraine, on Thursday, March 3, 2022, philanthropic leaders had already donated \$2 million and encouraged the community to match the donation. Members of the community added over \$2 million, reaching the goal of \$4 million. Over 3,600 donations were contributed to the Utah for Ukraine Fund managed by the Community Foundation of Utah. Ninety percent of those donations were \$100 or less.

Utah's First Lady Abby Cox's initiative, Show Up, organized efforts of more than 500 volunteers to sort and prepare donations for distribution and collected more than 25,000 cards from Utah children to offer support, hope and love to refugee children. The Other Side Academy donated time to sort and count the donations to prepare them for shipment.

The Larry H. Miller Company and the Larry H. & Gail Miller Family Foundation delivered four shipping containers filled with donated supplies to Constanta, Romania, between November 2022 and January 2023. The Miller organization's Driven to Assist community fundraiser and donation drive raised \$4 million and collected 250 pallets of donated goods to benefit refugees fleeing Ukraine.

"The people of Utah came together in a time of need to try to bring love and warmth to the people of Ukraine," said Mircea Divricean, honorary consul general of Romania to Utah and president and CEO of the Kostopulos Dream Foundation. "As the aid from Utah has made it to the European Union Humanitarian HUB in Suceava, Romania, I am very happy to know those donations will come at a critical time to help and support Ukrainians in need."

DAVIS TEEN CENTERS

The Larry H. & Gail Miller Family Foundation and the Huntsman Foundation made a joint donation of \$1 million to Davis Education Foundation to construct teen resource centers in Davis School District.

Headed by Davis Education Foundation, the teen resource centers create safe spaces at school for at-risk students experiencing homelessness and other crisis. The centers allow students to shower, do laundry, study, eat and access critical resources such as hygiene essentials. Counselors and family service workers meet with students one-on-one in the centers to assess their needs, help them graduate from high school and complete college applications.

PERIOD PROJECT

The Period Project, an initiative of the Policy Project, brings together community organizations, government agencies, and private businesses to provide menstrual products to those in need. Through this program, the Utah Policy Project is working to ensure that all women and girls have access to the menstrual products they need, regardless of their economic circumstances. The initiative is promoting equity and reducing the impact of period poverty in the state.

HB 162 Period Products in Schools was passed by the Utah Legislature to provide free period products in every girls and all-gender bathroom in every Utah K-12 public and charter school. The Miller Family Foundation donated \$1 million to purchase and install the dispensers.
